This was our second year to participate in the Price Cutter Charity Championship by hosting a women's golf clinic. Proceeds from the tournament are donated to various local children's charities.

9/11 Honoring Our Local Heroes

On September 11, 2002 the Junior League of Springfield honored the local Fire Departments, by preparing their evening meal. Members of each fire station, in turn, came to the Junior League Headquarters to pick up their evening meal with recipes having been prepared by the Junior League members from the Junior League's nationally known cookbook, *Sassafras!*. The Junior League delivered desserts to the local police stations.



As a member of the Association of Junior Leagues International, which is headquartered in New York, we were affected by the loss of some of our members and their loved ones on September 11, 2001. As a tribute to those who lost their lives, and for those who risk their own to save them, we chose to honor our local firemen and police officers for their heroic efforts here in the Ozarks.

Founders Park Sculpture Dedication \$20,000

The Junior League of Springfield was honored to join the many community volunteers on July 11, 2003 to dedicate Founders Park and our sculpture, "Honor the Past, Imagine the Future". The sculpture was commissioned by the Junior League four years ago in celebration of the millennium, by the request of the Celebrate 2000 committee. Dana LaMair, a local artist, captured the theme of the past with a historical male figure, perhaps John Polk Campbell, holding the plans for the city and a little girl balancing on a futuristic sphere, with both figures reaching towards each other connecting the past with the future.



Ronald McDonald House – Tooth Truck \$25,425

Making a difference one smile at a time is the goal of the JLS and the Ronald McDonald Mobile Dental Unit.

The JLS volunteers spend two weeks a month assisting the Dental Unit staff as advocates for the children, escorting the children to and from their classrooms, teaching dental hygiene, and helping to alleviate any fears they might have. In a ten month period the Tooth Truck, in partnership with the Junior League volunteers, filled 3000 appointments, treating 1300 children here in the Ozarks.



Wonders of Wildlife \$2,000

The JLS partnered with the WOW education department, which provides a hand on learning program offering wildlife, outdoor and conservation education for students across Southwest Missouri. The Junior League's grant could be used for field trip scholarships or curriculum.

Lost & Found – Hearts for Hope \$16,950

In partnering with Lost and Found, a charitable organization focused on finding hope through grieving, the Junior League of Springfield enabled the organization to hire a part-time group coordinator with a master's in counseling. The JLS hopes that these children can be nurtured by the Lost and Found trained facilitators to experience some peace and hope after grieving the loss of their loved ones.

Kids on the Block

\$3,150

We love our puppets and for 18 years these puppets have educated local school children about how we are all different yet the same in so many ways. The children learn about physical disabilities such as cerebral palsy, blindness, deafness, and Down's syndrome. The ultimate lesson for the children is the "Golden Rule" to treat others the way you would want to be treated.

Educational Advancement of Youth

\$30,000

The JLS funded the Learning Center at the Bill Stalnaker Boys & Girls Club unit. Junior League funding enabled the Club to purchase furniture, computers, printers, bookshelves, educational software, books, encyclopedias, and consumable supplies to help make the learning center state of the art. JLS volunteers were trained in reading recovery in order to provide tutoring at the Kenyon unit during the school year.

Breast Cancer Foundation of the Ozarks

A Time to Share

\$4,900

A one day event geared toward promoting breast cancer awareness. What a wonderful way to support, educate and celebrate cancer patients. The Junior League of Springfield is financially responsible for the infrastructure of the event, keynote speaker, audio-visual production, and some of the convention center charges.

Mary Riley Wolfe Scholarships

\$4,000

This year the JLS awarded four scholarships towards college expenses. The four young ladies chosen exemplified leadership, voluntarism and scholastic achievement.

Greene County Teen Court

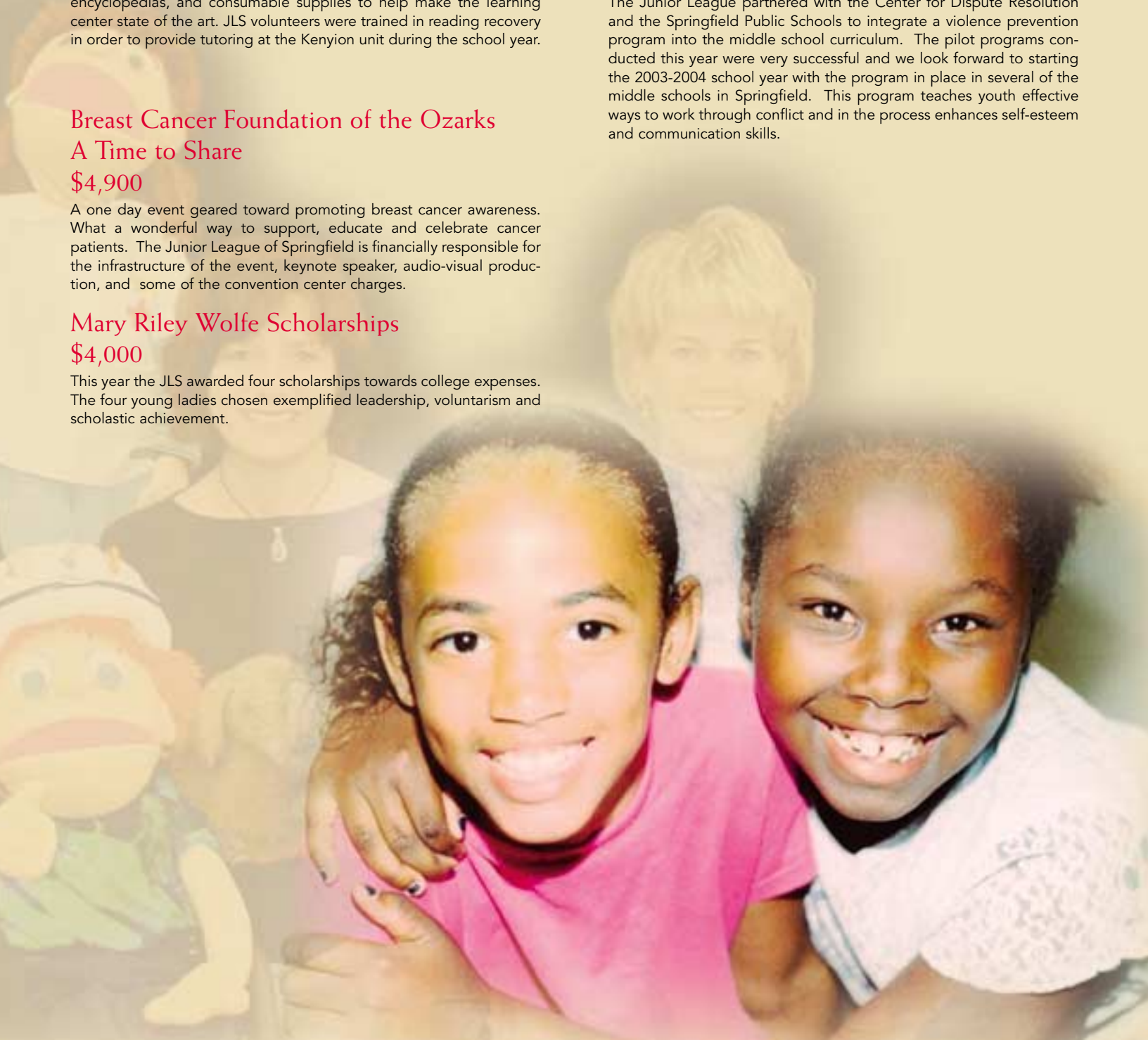
\$4,150

This alternative sentencing program run for teens by teens continues to make a difference in young peoples lives in the Ozarks. Not only the juveniles who have committed a crime, but also the volunteer high school students serving as legal council. The JLS believes strongly in the program and has funded it for four years with our volunteers serving as legal council advisors. Despite the fact that Teen Court now receives referrals for repeat offenders, it maintains a very low recidivism rate of 11%.

Program for Young Negotiators

\$10,313

The Junior League partnered with the Center for Dispute Resolution and the Springfield Public Schools to integrate a violence prevention program into the middle school curriculum. The pilot programs conducted this year were very successful and we look forward to starting the 2003-2004 school year with the program in place in several of the middle schools in Springfield. This program teaches youth effective ways to work through conflict and in the process enhances self-esteem and communication skills.



The \$14,500 reduction in Net Assets was primarily due to a planned payment to Habitat for Humanity of \$15,000 for a project performed in fiscal year 2002. Additionally, the JLS purchased its headquarters from the Springfield Public Schools in May, 2003 and incurred costs associated with this purchase. The purchase caused a reduction in long-term investments but an increase in Property and Equipment.

Before these payments, the JLS showed strong operating results for the year. This stands as testimony to the excellent work performed by this year's Board of Directors and Executive Committee. The Board of Directors established an unrestricted reserve for improvements to be made to the JLS Headquarters in the near future.
