In April 1959, five women formed the Community Service League of Springfield. Their vision was to make a positive contribution to Springfield through volunteer and fundraising efforts. The Community Service League was accepted into the Association of Junior Leagues International (AJLI) in 1976, becoming it's 231st member and the Junior League of Springfield. Today AJLI consists of nearly 300 member leagues internationally.
