# Little Black Dress Initiative



FEBRUARY 15TH - 19TH

Our fifth annual Little Black Dress Initiative (LBDI) was held during the month of February, and featured a community education as well as a fundraising component. LBDI is a global initiative started by the Junior League of London to raise awareness of the impact of generational poverty. LBDI participants wear the same little black dress for five consecutive days to illustrate the effects poverty can have on a woman's access to resources, her confidence, and her professional opportunities while soliciting donations for our mission. This year featured virtual events such as a charcuterie board making class, an educational seminar on generational poverty, and a "Give it Up" Campaign, encouraging participants to donate funds they would have normally spent on breakfast/coffee/lunch out. JLS also partnered with businesses in our community to raise poverty awareness in our community. Our members and community partners raised **\$3,885** for our mission!



# VIRTUAL CHARITY BALL: BLACK & WHITE CASINO NIGHT

Junior League of Springfield's 62nd Annual Charity Ball – Black & White Casino – was held virtually on April 17, 2021. Due to the global COVID-19 pandemic, JLS Management Team and Board of Directors made the difficult decision to make the event virtual-only. This decision was not taken lightly and was made with the safety of our attendees, members, and community in mind. We are grateful to the Charity Ball and Finance Council members and leadership for pivoting to take this event virtual. Despite the unprecedented circumstances we faced this year, Charity Ball raised approximately **\$21,101.90** for our mission.

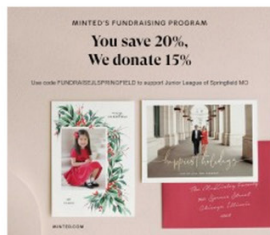
# ANNUAL CAMPAIGN

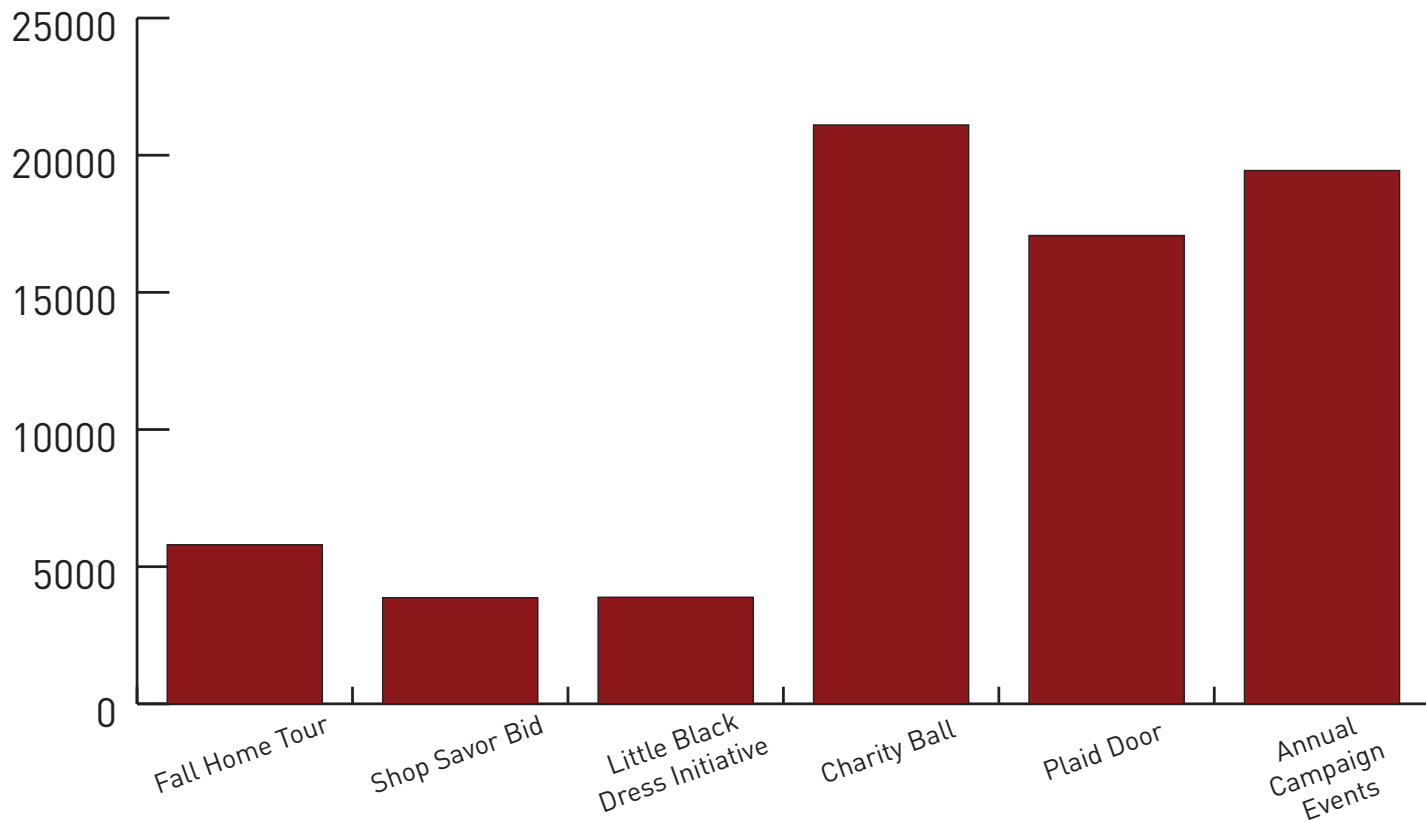
